Emergency Overnight Shelter - shelter offered one night at a time. Walk-ups are not allowed and beds are not reserved. Admission based on a lottery system. Lottery posted at the Women's Center of Wake County (WCWC) 24 hrs in advance. Call to add your name or check on daily list. Pick-up at WCWC (112 Cox Ave.) at 3:15pm daily.

Sobering Up Center - Non-medical Detox. Access 24/7 walk-in, drop off, or pick up (from public locations only). Typical stay 3-5 days.

Addiction Recovery Program - long-term, 12-step based, peer-run program for homeless women with alcohol and other drug addictions. Typically takes 12-18 months to complete. Over 80% of women who complete the recovery program are sober one year after completion.

Emergency Overnight Shelter - shelter offered one night at a time. Walk-ups are not allowed and beds are not reserved. In order to enter the emergency night shelter, men must be at the South Wilmington Street Center by 4pm each day for the van pick-up.

Sobering Up Center - Non-medical Detox. Access 24/7 walk-in, drop off, or pick up (from public locations only). Typical stay 3-5 days.

Addiction Recovery Program - long-term, 12-step based, peer-run program for homeless women with alcohol and other drug addictions. Typically takes 12-18 months to complete. Over 60% of men who complete the recovery program are sober one year after completion.

Coordinated Intake - Information and Referral Line

Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-housing program. Family must have a source of income. Application and assessment required. Call for an appointment.

Rental Assistance Housing Program (RAHP) services chronic homeless and diagnosable mental health disability population with supportive services conducted by case managers to assist clients in their ability to remain living independently.

Other housing services:

Consumer Credit Counseling provides one on one and group financial counseling. Certified by the National Foundation for Credit Counseling and HUD Approved counseling agency in partnership with the NC Housing Finance Agency.
