Children become better prepared for school and success later in life as the CDC breaks the “future” cycle of homelessness in the life of a child by early intervention “today”.

letter from landlord on letterhead, cancelled check or money order receipt), 5. Final notice for a utility bill, proof of utility deposit or court eviction papers for rental assistance.
