The Supportive Employment Program provides intensive employment support to Wake County residents (18 years of age and older) who have severe mental illness and overlapping disabilities. Individualized supports are provided by employment specialists to help consumers find competitive employment in integrated job settings. Community based services such as job development, job placement and coaching services are provided; follow-along supports are maintained indefinitely. Supportive Employment also serves Work First consumers who need intensive employment support.

Wake County Human Services operates two programs through the Workforce Investment Act: 1) Adult Program; 2) Dislocated Worker Program. Both offer assistance with job search and/or training to assist customers in re-entering the workforce. The WIA Adult Program determines eligibility on an individual basis based on the individual's employment or economic situation. The WIA Dislocated Worker Program assists persons who have lost their job due to layoffs, plant

closings, economic downturns or natural disasters. 4 to 6 month waiting list.
